

DAILY ACTIVITIES:

Each day campers will arrive at camp and break into their groups. Attendance will be taken and campers will be prepared for their first activity - all rules of animal handling will be reviewed.

Junior Zoo Keeper - During our Junior Zoo Keeper rounds campers will provide the animals with all their basic daily care. This includes cleaning their enclosures and providing them with new bedding and fresh water. Campers will check their enclosures for safety and also prepare their outdoor space for their time outside. *Please note - caring and cleaning the animals cages/enclosures is required by all campers - we feel it is very important for all campers to understand the commitment animals require when they are kept in captivity.

Hands on Animal Education - During each period of Hands on Animal Education campers will be exposed to different animals to complete an educational hands on session. During this session the campers will handle the animals and learn about them.

Food Prep & Feeding Tour - A large part of the day in caring for zoo and safari animals is feeding them. During this session campers will prepare the food for the animals and attend the feeding tour in which the animals are fed.

Enrichment Program for Various Species - The animals that live at the zoo need constant enrichment to ensure that they are happy and active. Campers will build and create different toys and activities for the animals to play with to ensure that they lead happy, healthy lives.

Snacks - Safari Camp is a very busy day with a lot of physical activity. Campers tend to be very hungry, we do allocate a time in the morning and afternoon for a snack. We recommend you send your camper each day with two snacks and plenty of drinks.

Scrapbooks - At the end of the day we complete our scrapbooks of what we did for the day and some of our favorite activities. At the end of camp, campers take these home to share with their families.
